From Place d'Armes to Place Jacques-Cartier, including the Royal Bank, Notre-Dame Basilica, Cours Le Royer, St. Jacques, Notre-Dame and St. Paul Streets, City Hall, the Champ de Mars and the old Bonsecours Market.</p>	
<p>Montreal Biodome</p>	<p>Some 13 million visitors have traveled through this "house of life", dazzled by the discoveries that await them along a path reflecting a concept unique in the world. Here, plants and animals by the thousands, cliffs and waterways, even the climate itself recreate with stunning realism the four finest ecosystems of the Americas.</p>	
<p>Montreal Botanical Garden</p>	<p>With its collection of 22,000 plant species and cultivars, 10 exhibition greenhouses, some thirty thematic gardens, and teams of researchers and activities staff, the Montréal Botanical Garden ranks as one of the world's largest and most spectacular botanical gardens. No matter what the season, visitors to the Montréal Botanical Garden are sure to be captivated by the colors and fragrances from around the world.</p>	
<p>Montreal Insectarium</p>	<p>The Insectarium aims first and foremost to awaken visitors to the wonders of the insect world, and to explain how insects play an essential part in ensuring the Earth's ecological balance. Along with its educational mission, the Insectarium has important cultural and scientific roles, too.</p>	
<p>Montreal Planetarium</p>	<p>The mission of the Montréal Planetarium is to familiarize the general public with the natural sciences and nature and to teach people about astronomy in particular. Since 1966, the Montréal Planetarium has offered multimedia shows for people of all ages, designed to reveal the fascinating world of astronomy and space exploration.</p>	
<p>Notre Dame Basilica</p>	<p>The magnificent interior sculpted in wood, paint and gold leaf and the boldly modern design of the Notre-Dame du Sacré-Coeur Chapel, captivate hundreds of thousands of visitors each year. Paintings, sculptures and stained-glass windows illustrate biblical passages as well as 350 years of parish history. In the evening a sound and light show presents the founding of Montréal and the Notre-Dame Basilica.</p>	
<p>Montreal Museum of Fine Arts</p>	<p>The Montreal Museum of Fine Arts is one of Canada's oldest art museums, and through the years, it has become one of the country's most important art institutions. Its encyclopedic permanent collection represents all types of arts from Antiquity to today, and is among the most impressive in North America. The schedule of temporary exhibitions greatly contributes to the museum's enviable reputation.</p>	
<p>Montreal Science Centre and IMAX Theater</p>	<p>The Science Centre's amazing, fun, and surprising exhibitions allow visitors to explore, learn, and understand through a variety of interactive means. The mission of the Montréal Science Centre is to help visitors of all ages acquire an understanding of science and technology for use in building their future.</p>	
<p>Biosphere</p>	<p>This museum and exhibition hall is dedicated to raising environmental and ecological awareness among its visitors. Housed in the world's largest geodesic dome, it offers four levels of guided discovery. The bottom level examines water as both "Source of Life" and "Source of Delight;" the Connections Hall showcases multimedia presentations focusing on environmental protection; and the Visions Hall affords an incredible 360 degree view of Montreal.</p>

<p>Orchestre Métropolitain du Grand Montréal</p>	<p>Founded in 1981 by graduates of faculties and conservatories of Music in Quebec, the Orchestre Métropolitain and has distinguished itself in its goal of promoting classical music and Canadian talent to the public at large. With its unique artistic direction and pedagogical approach, the OM is a veritable institution at the heart of Montréal cultural life.</p>	
<p>Olympic Park</p>	<p>Built for the 1976 Summer Olympic Games, the Olympic Stadium is the Park's centerpiece. Impressive in size and shape, and topped by the tallest inclined tower in the world, the Olympic Stadium quickly became a choice location for major events. A funicular-type elevator brings visitors to the top three observation floors, where they have a superb view of Montréal and its surroundings.</p>	
<p>Laser Quest</p>	<p>Live action Laser Tag at it's best! Donning the most sophisticated laser tag equipment available, the game is played in a large, multi-level arena featuring specialty lighting, swirling fog and heart-pounding music.</p>	
<p>Six Flags at La Ronde</p>	<p>The crazy fun promises to continue for thrill-seekers of all ages at Montreal's La Ronde amusement park. Well-known favorites include the Monster, Vampire and Splash, where boat riders shoot the chute down a 15 meter drop!</p>

The Bonsecours Market, acknowledged as one of Canada's finest heritage buildings, has become an essential stop on a visit to Old Montreal.
